**BRIDGE TRAFFIC FOR THE MONTH OF FEBRUARY 2008**

Bridge traffic for the month of February increased 3% to 2,963,314 vehicles as compared to the previous year's total of 2,877,086 vehicles during the month of February. Average daily traffic reflects a decrease from 102,753 in February 2007, to 102,183 in February 2008. The highest traffic day recorded was Thursday, February 14 when 115,544 vehicles crossed the Bridge. It is noted that 2008 was a leap year, consisting of 29 days in the month of February (Attachment 1).

**BRIDGE TRAFFIC FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH 2008**

Bridge traffic for the month of March decreased 1.2% to 3,339,680 vehicles as compared to the previous year's total of 3,381,982 vehicles during the month of March. Average daily traffic reflects a decrease from 109,096 in March 2007, to 107,732 in March 2008. The highest traffic day recorded was Thursday, March 27 when 118,660 vehicles crossed the Bridge (Attachment 2).

**FERRY STATISTICS – MAY 2008**

During the month of May, Larkspur ferry service carried 118,266 passengers. Morning commute runs carried 33,331 passengers, and evening commute runs carried 44,319. A total of 994 crossings were scheduled and 993 completed; one crossing was cancelled on May 23<sup>rd</sup> due to a mechanical failure of the *M.V. Del Norte*. Of the 993 crossings completed, 22 were AT&T Park crossings. Averages were:

A total of 498 crossings were scheduled and 491 completed. Seven crossings were cancelled on May 23rd, 2008, due to a mechanical failure of the *M.S. Del Norte* when the *M.S. Marin* was used for Larkspur service. Averages were:
