REPORT OF THE GENERAL MANAGER BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING OF AUGUST 26, 2022

UPDATE ON CLIPPER® BAYPASS (INSTITUTIONAL PASS PILOT PROGRAM)

On August 15, 2022, the Bay Area's Institutional Transit Pass Pilot Program (branded as "Clipper BayPass") began as Clipper cards loaded with the newly branded Clipper BayPass product were made available to randomly selected students making up about 25% of the student populations at San Francisco State University, San Jose State University, U.C. Berkeley and Santa Rosa Community College. Next, the program will be launched in September 2022 at several affordable housing properties.

In this initial phase of the pilot program, the pass is being made available at no cost to participating students and residents of the selected affordable housing properties. The BayPass allows unlimited travel on all Bay area public transit agencies that use Clipper, including the District's buses and ferries. Promotional materials have been developed to communicate program details to participants.

The objective of the regional pilot program is to evaluate the degree to which an institutional transit pass covering all operators may increase transit ridership and better meet the needs of users and institutions, as compared to single-agency fare instruments. The pilot program will evaluate program performance and collect data that could be used as the basis of a revenue model for a potential permanent program.

MTC will serve as lead agency for BayPass's Federal Transit Administration (FTA) Title VI process. This initial phase will be considered a "pilot" under Title VI, meaning agency boards will only be asked to consider approving Title VI analyses before any permanent successor program is launched.

2022 ACHIEVEMENT OF EXCELLENCE IN PROCUREMENT AWARD

For the fifth year in a row, the District's Procurement Department has received the prestigious Achievement of Excellence in Procurement® (AEP) Award from the National Procurement Institute (NPI). The AEP Award is earned by public and non-profit agencies that demonstrate a

commitment to procurement excellence. This annual program recognizes procurement organizations that embrace Innovation, Professionalism, Productivity, Leadership and e-Procurement. This award is sponsored by all major professional procurement associations across North America. The District was one of only eight transit authorities out of 171 total agencies across the United States and Canada to receive the award. Our procurement team continues to maintain its high standards of excellence and is a leader in their profession.


DISTRICT PARTICIPATION IN 2022 PISTAHAN PARADE AND FESTIVAL

The District's Security and Roadway Services Department participated in the 2022 Pistahan (pronounced "PEE-stah-hahn") Parade and Festival. "Pistahan" in the Tagalog language means "festival" or "feast. This year's event marks the 29th Pistahan Festival in San Francisco.

In this year's event, Bridge Captain Elauria collaborated with Christina Capello, the Director of the San Francisco Bay Area Chapter with the American Foundation for Suicide Prevention, as the Foundation wished to convey gratitude to the Bridge Security team for the role they play in suicide intervention and prevention at the Bridge. We hope to continue to participate in Bay Area cultural events, in collaboration with our Public Affairs Department, as operations and resources allow, allowing for potential recruitment opportunities as well as strengthening community relations.

ALEXANDER AVENUE ROADWAY REPAVING

Earlier this month Bridge Division maintenance staff repaved two areas on Alexander Avenue roadway that were exhibiting pavement distress. The areas that were repaved are in both the north and south bound directions of travel. The new repaved sections on Alexander Avenue will improve safety for cyclists and vehicles alike. Additional roadway repair work is planned in the future for Alexander Avenue.





UPDATE ON IMPACTS OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC ON DISTRICT OPERATIONS

The United States Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) relaxed its COVID-19 guidelines on August 11th, marking an evolution in our pandemic journey. As of today, about 95 percent of all Americans have some immunity against COVID, either due to vaccination or infection, and the current variants are proving to be much less lethal as compared to the initial waves of COVID.

The new CDC guidelines reflect the current state of the pandemic in the United States, and, fortunately, we are in a very different place compared to 2-1/2 years ago. This is welcome news, and we look forward to the continued return of travel in the Golden Gate Corridor.

During the week of August 7th ridership was down on our buses by about 58 percent (we only carried 42 percent of our normal bus ridership) and our ferry ridership was down 53 percent (we are only carried 47 percent of our normal ferry ridership). Bridge traffic was down about 18 percent when compared to the same week, pre-COVID.

The District continues to add back bus and ferry service in a measured fashion consistent with the return of our customers travelling in the Golden Gate Corridor.

REVENUES

The District's revenues for the week of August 7th were down approximately \$1.1 million. As compared to the same week pre-pandemic, for the week of August 7th, Bus ridership was down 58 percent, ferry ridership was down about 53 percent and Bridge traffic down about 18 percent.

The District collected about 82 percent of our pre-COVID amount of tolls, so tolls for transit were about 64 percent [(82-50) / 50 = 64%] of our usual amount, or tolls for transit were down about 36 percent last week.

RESEARCH EFFORTS CONTINUE TO COLLECT WORKPLACE REOPENING DATA

The Metropolitan Transportation Commission (MTC) has partnered with the Bay Area Council to conduct research with employers regarding their plans for reopening workplaces and bringing nonessential workers back. They have been surveying these employers for 16 months to monitor developments in workplace reopening plans. The survey results reflect information on Bay Area employers' return to work plans to assist transit agencies in planning for the future. Going forward, The Bay Area Council will continue surveying the Employer Network every other month instead of monthly and we will continue to share their findings.


