

## About Alameda CTC

Alameda CTC is a joint powers authority that plans, funds and delivers transportation programs and projects that expand access and improve mobility to foster a vibrant and livable Alameda County.



### Local Business Contract Equity Program

The Alameda County Transportation Commission (Alameda CTC) has established the Local Business Contract Equity (LBCE) Program to create economic growth and jobs within Alameda County by requiring local contracting that supports residents and businesses in the county.

#### The LBCE Program contributes to the overall economic vitality of the county

- Encourages businesses to locate and remain in Alameda County
- Provides employment opportunities for residents of the county
- Generates economic activity and stimulates the local economy

The LBCE Program identifies and engages the participation of **Local Business Enterprise (LBE)**, **Small Local Business Enterprise (SLBE)** and **Very Small Local Business Enterprise (VSLBE)** firms located in Alameda County on contracts throughout the county. **To participate, firms must become certified with the Alameda CTC.**

#### The LBCE Program has robust LBE and SLBE goals on all locally-funded contracts

- Construction: 60% LBE and 20% SLBE
- Professional Services: 70% LBE and 30% SLBE (30% VSLBE for contracts greater than \$25,000 and equal to or less than \$75,000)

### Key Eligibility Requirements

- Valid business license within Alameda County for at least six months

- Fixed place of business with a working office within Alameda County for at least six months
- Staffing of at least one full-time equivalent employee at the local working office

### Program Benefits

- Receive up to 10% of total bid evaluation points during the selection process for contracts over \$75,000:
  - 5% for LBE goal
  - 5% for SLBE goal
- Receive notice of upcoming:
  - Contracting opportunities
  - Networking events
  - Training opportunities
- Opportunity for growth and exposure
- Inclusion in LBCE Certified Firms database
